A Message from Bishop David



Dear young friends in Christ,

I don't know how many of you have had the opportunity to visit the Cathedral Church of our diocese, here in Northampton? The Cathedral Church of the Bishop of Rome is called the St John Lateran Basilica.

This is the Cathedral of Pope Francis. And as you walk down the centre of this ancient and beautiful church, you will see either side of you, the statues of the apostles. They all look very serious. They all look as though they have been working out in the gym for many hours! They are larger than life. This makes me smile!

When we read the New Testament, we cannot help but notice that St Peter was certainly not larger-than-life. He had his weaknesses and struggles. When Jesus was taken to the Cross, where was Peter? He denied three times knowing Jesus, and then he ran away. He was filled with shame and it took him quite a time to get his head around his betrayal of the Lord. What was St Paul doing when Jesus appeared to him? He was on his way to Damascus to have the first Christians imprisoned and killed. These do not sound to me like larger-than-life characters! They certainly had their weaknesses, but they also had something else. They both grew to love Jesus and wanted above everything else to do as well as his followers.

You and I certainly have our weaknesses. On the Feast of these great apostles, you may like to make a list of what you think are your weaknesses. Think about this list and then turn to Jesus with bold confidence and trust. Being a Christian is not about being perfect. It is about being someone who can put their trust in Jesus and know that his love will give us everything we need to do what he wants us to do in our lives. May Jesus our Master give us the strength to pick ourselves up when we have let him down, and the gifts we need to follow him as his disciples,





Once he was put in prison for speaking out about Jesus. When he came out of prison Peter continued his mission of building God's church. He travelled to Rome to preach the good news there.




At that time Christians were being persecuted in Rome and Peter was arrested and killed.

Today the Basilica of St Peter stands on the same spot.

What did Jesus mean when he asked Peter to 'Feed my lambs, feed my sheep'?


Paul used to be called Saul .

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles


Saul stayed in Damascus with the Christians.

He became good friends with them and learned a lot about Jesus from them. Saul began to preach and tell everyone about Jesus. The people were amazed!


They couldn't believe that this was the same person that had hated them so much. But it was.

Saul's name was later changed to Paul.


The Word of the Lord Thanks be to God

He preached the good news to everyone he met. He travelled far and wide and set up churches in the places he visited.




Paul wrote many letters to people in the Churches he had set up. Sometimes he went back to visit them.




The letters of St Paul are found in the New Testament of the bible.
