

What is a Family Worker?

Family Workers develop links between families and the school. Encouraging Parents, Grandparents and Carers to become more involved in school life. Research has shown that participating in your children's education can improve their learning and educational outcomes.



The role of the Family Worker is to, engage, encourage, enthuse and equip families to work in partnership with schools to improve outcomes for their children. Liaising between school, home, parents and professionals is an important part of the role.

Support and advice on a variety of topics is offered in school. As Family Workers we are available to discuss any concerns that

will help to support you and your child. Another important aim is to provide a range of activities that will support and promote the emotional and physical wellbeing for all children and their families.

What's happening in the Family Room?

Drop-in: Every morning you will find us out on the playground, or in the Family Room where we are available for a chat. Alternatively you may want to make an appointment if you need more time to discuss a concern.

Family Facing Activities: A wide variety of sessions take place to encourage you to have fun and join in with your child's learning experience.

Parent Information Workshops: Including Online safety and Anti-bullying workshops. This is an opportunity to come together to discuss any current topics and/or find out more information about the work in school.

Groups/Clubs for Children: Nurture, Chess, Lego, Draughts and Dominos, Mentoring, Cooking and Gardening.

Emotional Support for bereavement and change in homelife e.g. separation through Rainbows or 1:1 support.

Dad's Morning for KS1: lots of fun activities for Dads to become involved in with their children.
