Handwriting and presentation skills have always been an important part of the curriculum at St Josephs' but, this year, we are promoting these essential learning 'tools' even more!

Research shows that being able to handwrite fluently and easily, improves memory, self-esteem and focus. It is also an essential part of learning and developing reading skills.

We want all our children to feel comfortable and at ease with a pen or pencil in their hand. Regular handwriting sessions, intervention groups, rewards and incentives to keep trying when things are challenging are all part of the school's drive towards everyone becoming a Handwriting Hero!



Fairtrade:

As you are aware we are a Fairtrade school and we were delighted to welcome back our Fairtrade Tuckshop, which we ran with huge success in previous years.

Despite a growing awareness of Fairtrade products sourcing tuckshop items has been a real struggle and I would like to thank Mrs Dino and the Fairtrade team for all their hard work in restarting this wonderful initiative.

The tuckshop visited classes in EYFS, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 this week. We are initially selling a variety of individually wrapped Fairtrade biscuits. Every biscuit purchased helps to support Fairtrade farmers in developing countries, giving them a fair wage and opportunities to sustain their livelihood. In this way we are serving our global neighbours in the name of Jesus.

Over the coming months we hope to add more items to our tuckshop and we will keep you updated with any further developments.

We will advise you when dates have been set.



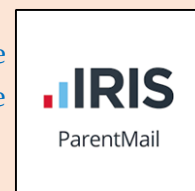
Contact details and pupil medical information:

Please ensure that all your telephone numbers and address details **are correct and regularly updated**, in particular changes to mobile numbers. **This is extremely important in the event of an emergency.** It is also essential that you advise the school of any medical conditions relating to your child and that you keep the school updated of any changes to medication for our records.

ParentMail:

ParentMail is our main source of communication to parents and carers and we would advise for ease of access and instant notifications, that the ParentMail app is downloaded to all mobile devices.

We would also like to remind parents and carers to update any changes to their email or mobile numbers via the app. If you are having any difficulty accessing ParentMail then please contact the KS2 office who will be happy to help you.



School Parking:

You will be aware through recent ParentMail correspondence that local residents have made us aware of inconsiderate parking and verbal abuse by our parents and carers, whilst dropping off and picking up their children from school.

Whilst, we appreciate there is limited parking around the school, we are trying to work together to ensure that we respect and value the local neighbours and area.

Parents should not be blocking driveways, parking on residents' drives, confronting residents or stopping in the middle of the road. This is not a safe way for our children to travel to school and their safety is paramount. We continue to seek advice from the local authority in regard to parking difficulties and Traffic Control will be increasing patrols in the area.
