Further information regarding these meetings and how to arrange appointments will be sent home via ParentMail, by the School Office nearer the time.















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
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KS1 Christmas Art Competition

As we return to school after the Christmas period we have talked to the children about the fresh start that a new year brings. In assemblies we have reminded the children that we are a faith community whose aim is to live out the Gospel values by showing love, kindness and tolerance to everyone, as Jesus did.

Our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors are continuing their important role by encouraging us all to promote random acts of kindness.

School Uniform:

Please note that all children should be wearing the correct uniform to school. Grey track suit trousers are not acceptable and during inclement weather boots etc can be worn into school, however the children will be expected to change into school shoes whilst in the school building.

We fully appreciate that there are so many financial demands on families at the moment, and I would therefore like to remind parents and carers that our Family Workers are more than happy to support with uniform should you need anything.

In line with school policy, jewellery is limited and **only** watches and stud earrings should be worn. Also nail polish, gel or acrylic nails are not appropriate and must be removed following a holiday.

Healthy Eating:

The leek was considered to be a superfood in Ancient Rome, Egypt, and Greece. In fact, Emperor Nero ate so many leeks that he was even referred to as 'Porrophagus,' which is Latin for 'Leek Eater.'

The vegetable also impacted Celtic cultures – as the Irish and Welsh believed it to have mystical properties. Under the advice of a Celtic monk, the Welsh army wore helmets adorned with a leek emblem in the Battle of Heathfield in 633 AD. This apparently proved effective, as the Welsh defeated the Saxons. Welsh loyalty to this vegetable didn't end there-today the leek remains the national symbol of Wales.
