Year 2 Curriculum September 2020

Dear Parents and Carers,

We welcome you and your children to Year 2 and the start of a very busy term. For your information we are sending you an overview of the curriculum your child will be covering this term. We will continue to teach an ambitious and broad curriculum in all subjects from the start of the Autumn term. Please be assured we will use teacher assessment prior to learning any new content, to address any areas missed due to school closure.

During the Autumn term there will be an opportunity to have formal feedback on how your child has settled into their new class and year group.

<p>Religious Education: Topics covered this term:</p> <p>Family: In Year 2 we will focus on Beginnings. We will explore how God is present at every beginning. The children will explore how some beginnings are difficult and others easy. Through the story of Creation the children will learn that God made the world, including us, and that He loves us.</p> <p>Belonging: The Year 2 focus is Signs and Symbols. We will be learning about the signs and symbols connected with Baptism and the significance of each rite within the celebration.</p> <p>Loving: The Year 2 focus is Preparations. We will be preparing for the Birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas and exploring how God sent Jesus into the world as a very special gift because He loves us.</p> <p>Other Faiths: This term the children will also spend time learning about the faith tradition of Judaism.</p> <p>Sex and Relationships: We will be using the 'Christopher Winter' programme as an additional SRE curriculum resource this year.</p>	<p>English:</p> <p>Handwriting – the expectations in handwriting for the end of Year 2 have been raised by the new more challenging curriculum. Our children will have daily handwriting practise that will focus on writing letters that are consistent in size and we will start to practise and apply letter joins.</p> <p>Grammar - to learn how to use sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command and punctuate them using capital letters, full stops, question and exclamation marks.</p> <p>Poetry - to learn some traditional poems.</p> <p>Fiction – to develop pleasure in reading. Exploring stories with familiar settings and traditional tales. Some of our literacy this term will be based around our topic of "Tiaras and Turrets" with different opportunities for writing.</p> <p>Parents and Carers can support the curriculum by hearing their child read regularly and recording this in their diary, as well as encouraging them to learn spellings.</p> <p>Phonics – Daily phonics will continue as part of our catch-up programme. We will be preparing the children for their phonic screening, which will take place before the end of the Autumn term. Further details will be sent home in a separate letter.</p>
<p>Maths: Please note that the Calculation Policy is in the Home and School Diary –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Place value, ordering of numbers, reading scales. • Addition (+) and subtraction (-), developing mental strategies. • Solving money and measure problems • 2-D shapes. • Time - Read time on digital/analogue clocks to nearest quarter of hour • Fractions - halves and quarters. <p>At home, parents can support their children with the learning of number bonds to 5, 10 and 20 as well as counting in 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s.</p>	<p>Science:</p> <p>Everyday Materials: Children will identify and compare the uses of a variety of everyday materials and their uses. They will find out how shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.</p> <p>Plants: The children will observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. They will be introduced to the requirements of plants for germination, growth and survival as well as the processes of reproduction and growth. They will find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.</p>

<p>Computing:</p> <p>To support the computing curriculum, the children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Become confident in using an iPad to take photographs and recordings. • Become confident in how to use technology safely. • Use Seesaw to record some of their learning through the use of pictures and annotations. <p>Online safety: This forms an integral basis of all the computing learning in Year 2. The children will be taught how to stay safe when using the internet by keeping their personal information to themselves.</p>	<p>P.E.</p> <p>All Year 2 children will have two PE lessons per week, one indoor and one outdoor lesson. The pupils will participate in Gymnastics and Dance during P.E. sessions this term.</p> <p>Games sessions will include a rota of outdoor invasion games skills and indoor games that develop the children's ability to travel safely with increasing control.</p>
<p>Creative Curriculum: (including the Key Skills in Geography, History, Art and D.T.)</p> <p>'Tiaras and Turrets' During the first half term our Creative Curriculum topic will allow the children to explore famous British Kings and Queens and how their lives differ from ours. We will be exploring different castles from around the world and will study royal portraits to learn about the techniques used by different artists. As a particular focus we will learn about the lives of Queen Elizabeth I and Queen Victoria. We will launch our topic with a Medieval banquet and explore a number of castles virtually.</p> <p>'The UK' Our second topic in term will have a geography focus. We will be using maps and atlases to learn about the United Kingdom. The children will be able to name and locate the four countries that make up the UK as well as their capital cities. We will be exploring the cultures of the four UK countries by having our own Highland games, tasting famous foods from each country and we will have an exciting opportunity to connect with a school in Northern Ireland to compare and contrast the features of our locality and theirs.</p>	
<p>Music:</p> <p>In the Autumn term Year 2 learning will be focused around the song 'Hands, feet, heart'. The song represents an integrated approach to music where games, elements of music, singing and playing instruments are all linked.</p>	

Miscellaneous:

Please could you ensure your child brings all that is needed to school each day. Every child should be encouraged to read regularly, daily if they require it, and enjoy a wide variety of texts at home and if possible to visit the local library. They should also practise their number bonds. Please check the Home and School Diary to confirm tasks that have been set during the week and ensure your child returns their work promptly so that it can be marked and feedback given. **Later this term the children will continue to take part in the St. Joseph's Reading Race with a new set of texts for Year 2.**

Sadly, due to current situation, **Class Prayer Bags** cannot be sent home at this time. We would however, encourage you to set some time aside to pray as a family.

Times of **P.E.** sessions are recorded in the Home and School Diary. Please could you make sure that your child has their correct P.E. kit in school on the appropriate day, **clearly marked with their name.** May we also take this opportunity to remind parents that for health and safety reasons, **no jewellery can be worn during P.E. lessons** and those children who use inhalers must have them in school.

We are looking forward to beginning our work with you and your child during the coming term. **If you have any questions or concerns please contact the main school office to request a phone call from your child's class teacher or Year Leader.**
